Reiko, Ken, Tom, Eriko, Alice, and Ryota are junior high school students in Tokyo. They are going to make presentations in their English class. Reiko, Ken, and Tom are in Group A, and Eriko, Alice, and Ryota are in Group B. Tom and Alice are students from Australia.

Students in Group A are talking about their presentation.

*Reiko*: What should we talk about in our presentation? Do you have any ideas?

*Ken:* How about talking about \*Newton? I'm reading an interesting book about him. I think both of you know something about him.

Tom: Yes, of course. He discovered the law of \*gravity, right?

Reiko: Yes. (1) I've heard that he discovered the law when (1) saw 2 from 3 falling 4 tree

*Ken:* Right. Many people know that story about Newton, but actually, he discovered not only the law of gravity but also many other things. He also did a lot of experiments and research on light.

Tom: Also on light?

Ken: Yes. Have you ever heard of prisms? When light passes through a block of clear glass called a prism, the light changes into \*bands with several (2)-a colors that we see in a rainbow. This was one of Newton's greatest discoveries. He named each of those bands a spectrum. This discovery has changed our lives a lot and has been \*applied to various things, such as some cameras.

*Tom:* That's interesting.

*Ken:* According to the book I'm reading, he made that discovery on light without asking other scientists for help. Probably, he was a scientist who did research by himself every day.

*Tom:* Did he really make that important discovery without depending on other scientists?

Ken: Yes. The same thing can be said about many other discoveries he made. When he was about our age, he read lots of science books. He also did various experiments by himself to \*see if the things written in the books were really true. By doing so, he learned a lot about science. I think this \*approach made him a great scientist.

*Reiko:* I agree. I respect him not only for his discoveries, but I also respect him for his approach. If I were a scientist, I would not be able to work alone like Newton.

Students in Group B are talking about their presentation.

*Eriko*: What shall we talk about in our presentation?

Alice: How about talking about learning styles? I often have difficulty when I study Japanese.

Ryota: I think your Japanese is wonderful.

Alice: Thank you, but I often wish I could learn Japanese more easily. I think it's necessary to know a lot of words if we want to speak a foreign language well. So, I always write Japanese words again and again to \*memorize them, but it's really hard. Eriko, you are good at English. How do you study English? How do you memorize English words?

*Eriko*: First, I read a lesson in my English textbook many times. By reading it again and again, I can more easily memorize new words that appear in the lesson.

Alice: Do you mean you don't need to write new words on paper?

Alice: I see.

*Eriko*: This book gives us useful information about different learning styles. For example, many schools have introduced a learning style called group learning. In this style, students work together toward a common goal and share their opinions with each other.

*Ryota:* Oh, that's the style we are using right now. I like group learning because various activities, such as discussions and presentations, are done in group learning. I think this helps us a lot when we learn things.

Alice: I also think it is important to learn by working with other people. Everyone has their own opinions, and by learning (4) others think, we can see things from a wider point of view.

Ryota: I agree. Eriko, tell us about other learning styles in the book.

*Eriko*: Sure. There is another style called \*individual learning. In this style, students learn by themselves and don't work in groups. Students set their own goals and learn at their own \*pace.

Ryota: That style seems a little boring to me.

Tom: Yes. My favorite subject is history. When I was in Australia, my history teacher always spent a lot of time on group discussions and asked the class to share ideas with each other. The discussions showed me many (2)-b points of view that were new to me. Her class made me more interested in history.

Ryota: Your experience is a good example of group learning.

Alice: I think so, too. How about your group? What will be the topic of your presentation?

*Ken:* We are going to talk about Newton's approach to science. According to the book I'm reading, Newton learned a lot about science by reading books and doing experiments by himself. I think Newton was able to make a lot of discoveries because of this approach. His discovery on light was one of them.

*Ryota:* I didn't know that he usually learned and worked without depending on other scientists. If he made so many amazing discoveries in such a way, his way of learning can probably be called individual learning.

Alice: I agree. It is common for scientists to do experiments with other scientists, but Newton was quite (2)-c from them.

*Reiko:* Right. Many people believe that Newton was a \*genius. That's true, but we can also say that he was a hard worker. He never stopped learning and kept working by himself.

Alice: Let me ask you another question. Reiko, you speak English well. Do you have any advice for people who want to improve their English?

*Reiko*: I always carry my English textbook with me, and I read it on the bus to school every morning. In group discussions in class, I always try to talk with my classmates in English. Also, at home, I don't go to bed without reading my English textbook.

*Alice:* Thank you very much for good advice. I now understand that group learning and individual learning are both important.

*Tom:* I agree. We often think there is one \*absolute answer to the question, "What is the best learning style?" However, there is nothing like that.

*Eriko*: Exactly. When we try to learn things, we should not depend only on one learning style. It is really important to (6).


