Asuka High School is a credit-based high school.



What is a credit-based high school?

There is no division of curriculum according to grade level. There is no promotion or repetition of the grade level.

It is a school where each student makes a course plan.

To be qualified for graduation

- ① Complete all required courses (as specified in the curriculum guidelines)
- ② Acquire the required credits (74 credits or more)
- 3 The period of high school enrollment (including any previous schools) is 3 years or more
- Satisfactory participation in school events

Features of our school

In the first year, students mainly study compulsory subjects in a class-by-class timetable.

From the second year, you can choose and study subjects according to your interests based on your study plan.

There is no grade division and you can study at your own pace (3rd year graduation, 4th year graduation).

Our school is on a credit system, but there are activities and events in the lessons.

Japanese language education

Our school, where many foreign students are studying, also focuses on Japanese language education.

In cooperation with Meikai University, we offer Japanese classes in different levels.

From the 4th year of Reiwa (2022), you can choose "Japanese I" in the first year, and "Japanese II" and "Japanese III" from the second year.

In the first year, in addition to the "Japanese I" class, you will have Japanese lessons in any week when "people and Society" is not held.
