Someone gives his seat to you on the train when you are not feeling well. Someone picks up your smartphone when you drop it. So, why did they do such kind things for you? Maybe it was because they were just very nice people. Maybe it was because they \*happened to be in a good mood. Or maybe it was because of "helper's high." I first experienced it in my country two years ago.

I felt that being kind to others makes not only them happy, but also ourselves.

So, we should be kinder in our daily lives and more helpful to others if we want to live a wonderful life. \*Looking back, I bought that sandwich in the restaurant because I just felt like doing something (6)-afor others.
