Yumi is a first year student in high school in Tokyo. Laura is a high school student from France. She is staying at Yumi's home for three months to study Japanese and Japanese culture. Yumi and Laura are visiting Yumi's grandfather, Kazuyoshi Sugiyama. Yumi is introducing Kazuyoshi to Laura.

Yumi: Laura, this is my grandpa.

Laura: Hello, nice to meet you, Mr. Sugiyama. I'm Laura Martin. I'm from France.

Kazuyoshi: Hi, Laura. Nice to meet you, too. Welcome to my house.

Yumi: This is my grandpa's \*workshop.

Laura: Wow, there are a lot of \*tools and machines which I have never seen before.

Laura: Let's see.... Are they for making bags or something?

Yumi: Ah, you are close. My grandpa is a watchmaker.

Laura: A watchmaker? Do you make watches by yourself?

Kazuyoshi: Yes. Originally a watchmaker makes watches, but now almost all watches are \*factory-made.

So I \*repair and \*maintain watches most of the time.

Yumi: He used to be a math teacher at high school.

Laura: Oh, really? Were you a high school teacher?

Kazuyoshi: Yes, I was. I taught math for thirty five years. And I enjoyed teaching math to my students.

Laura: I think teaching math and repairing watches are very different. (2)

Kazuyoshi: Well, I have liked to make something since I was young. And I also like collecting watches. So, after I \*retired from high school, I went to school to learn about watches to become a watchmaker.

Laura: How long did you study at that school?

Kazuyoshi: For three years. A watchmaker needs to know everything about watches, not only the \*mechanism but also designs, history and so on.

Laura: I see. Is it difficult to repair watches?

Kazuyoshi: Yes, it is. Watches are made of so many \*parts, and they are all very small. And they don't work \*right (3) even one piece. So I feel very happy when a broken watch starts working again.

Laura: Do a lot of people ask you to repair their watches?

Kazuyoshi: Yes, they do. You may think it is easier and even cheaper to buy a new watch. Actually in many cases that is true, but a lot of people come to me. Do you know why?

Laura: Well..., because they like their watches, right?

Kazuyoshi: Yes. (4) They do so because they love their watches. A month ago, an old man brought a broken

watch to me. He said it was the watch given by his wife fifty years ago. And he had a lot of memories with the watch. I believe watches share time with the \*owners. They share both good times and bad times.

Yumi: Did you repair the broken watch?

Kazuyoshi: Yes, I did. I knew it was very important to him. So I wanted to be a help for him. And I started the repairing work right after the man brought me the watch. Laura: Did the man come to get the watch?
