In 2012, the Japanese government proposed that UNESCO register the country's food culture. The proposal was accepted at a meet ing of \*the UNESCO Intergovernmental Committee in December 2013, and "washoku" — traditional Japanese \*cuisine — was added to UNESCO's \*Intangible Cultural Heritage list, which also includes kabuki, noh and bunraku. An official said that the \*panel valued Japanese people's spiritual tradition of respecting nature associated with washoku.

Japan faces a low \*food self-sufficiency rate and the spread of Western eating habits. Social and economic structures are continually changing, and food products from around the world are widely available now. That is why many people are (1) concerned about whether communities can continue to pass down Japanese food traditions. The government hopes (2) the heritage listing will help younger generations recognize the value of such traditions.

It is also expected that washoku will gain global recognition, attract more foreign tourists and increase exports of Japan's agricultural products.
