

Today, Yuri and Akira are doing some sightseeing in her college town. They are visiting the information office now. Yuri comes here very often. Jane is an *advisor at the office.

Yuri: Hello Jane!

Jane: Hello Yuri!

Yuri: Jane, this is my brother, Akira.

Jane: Hello, Akira! Nice to meet you.

Akira: Hello! Nice to meet you, too.

Yuri: I'm taking my brother around the town today. I'll take him to the castle first. Can you give us any advice? I want him to experience the best parts of this town.

Jane: Yes, of course. Don't forget the town is famous not only for its castle, but also for its town walls. Why don't you climb up the town walls and walk to the castle?

Yuri: That's a good idea! I will do that.

Akira: (1-a) Can we walk on a town wall?

Yuri: Town walls were built all the way around the town to protect it. The *guards used to walk around on the top of the walls, so they could see any *danger.

Jane: If you take one of the walls, you can go to the *entrance of the castle. You can enjoy a good view of the town from the walls.

Akira: Sounds great.

Yuri: Thank you for your advice! Goodbye!

Jane: Enjoy the tour!

Now, Yuri and Akira are standing on a town wall.

Akira: Wow! It's so high up here. (1-b)

Yuri: They are about 10 meters high.

Akira: Look! Cherry blossoms are all over the town now. So beautiful!

Yuri: Not only in this town, but also all over England, you can enjoy cherry blossoms.

Akira: Yuri, do you know when the town walls were built?

Yuri: Yes, during *the Middle Ages.

Akira: When were the Middle Ages?

Yuri: They were from the year 900 to 1500.

Akira: Who lived *inside the town walls?

Yuri: People who could *fix *tools, build things, clean up and so on.

Akira: I see.

After their walk, they are still standing on the town wall. They look up at the castle.

Yuri: Now we are at the entrance of the castle. Let's go inside.

Akira: Such a large stone castle with high walls and towers! (1-c)

Yuri: Castles were both homes for kings and their families and *fortresses to protect their land.

Akira: Look! There are stairs in each tower. Can we go up?

Yuri: Sure.

They climb the stairs, and *halfway up the tower, they go out of the tower. They are now walking on the top of the castle walls.

Yuri: All the towers are connected by the castle walls. We can walk from one tower to another on the walls.

Akira: What are the *openings we see all over the castle?

Yuri: Some of them were for windows. Through them light came in, so during the day people were able to read and write without *candle light. Some openings were used to throw away *garbage and used water from baths.

Yuri: Yes. However, only the king and his family took baths.

 - [1] In February 2017, scientists *announced that they discovered a new *system of *planets, called TRAPPIST-1. People all over the world are now wondering, "Can we find life on these planets?"
 - [2] The *star of this system, also called TRAPPIST-1, is a very small red star with seven planets going around it. The name came from the *telescope in South America used to discover it. We can find the system in the *constellation of *Aquarius, and it is 39 light-years away from Earth. Its planets are called TRAPPIST-1b, 1c, 1d, 1e, 1f, 1g and 1h. They are all the size of Earth or *Venus, and they may all have water on them. TRAPPIST-1e, 1f and 1g are *probably in a habitable zone.
 - [3] Now, what is a habitable zone? It means life is possible there. Let's look at our Earth. We can live on Earth because it is at the right *distance from the right kind of star. Our sun is the right size to produce lots of energy for us and to keep burning for a long time. We are also lucky that the Earth moves around the sun at the right distance. If a planet is too close to its star, it will be too hot to have life. If it is too far away, it will be too cold.
 - ァ Venus is just like Earth, but the small difference in [4]Look at Venus. distance from the sun made a big difference on Venus. *Long ago, Venus was only a 1 little warmer than Earth and probably had oceans. But because of the small difference, Venus could not keep its water and became very hot. ゥ On the other side of Earth, we have another problem with *Mars. I It 才 The was also once a nicer place, but it is so far away from the sun. *atmosphere changed, and now it is too cold for life to live there.
 - [5] TRAPPIST-1 is an ultra-cool dwarf star. This means TRAPPIST-1 is a really cold, small star at 2,300 °C. You may not think that is really cold, but for a star, it is 2. For example, our sun is 5,500 °C. Our sun is about ten times bigger than TRAPPIST-1.
 - [6] How can life be on planets with such a small and cold star? Well, the planets are closer to their star. When planets are closer to their star, they go around it faster. While the Earth takes one year to go around the sun, TRAPPIST-1f takes only a little more than nine days.
 - [7] \mathcal{T} Can the TRAPPIST-1 planets really have life? \checkmark If we want to know about that, we need to find answers to some questions. \checkmark For example, what is the atmosphere made of? \checkmark How can we send people to this planet? \checkmark And, what kind of *geological activity does the planet have?
 - [8] You may wonder how we get information on such a far-away system. In most cases, by using telescopes. Until now, we got information by watching the system with one telescope on land, called TRAPPIST, and another telescope in *space, called Hubble.

[9] Soon, scientists will study the *climate and the atmosphere on each planet. The scientists think they may find things on the planets like *bacteria, flowers or trees. Living things leave signs. For example, trees send out *oxygen into the atmosphere, and when a planet passes in front of its star, the starlight is changed by the oxygen in the planet's atmosphere. We can watch such changes from the Earth.

 - [1] My name is Shunpei. I started high school only one year ago, but already I can see how much I have changed. At first, I was not good at speaking English, but now I can talk with others in English and I am leaving for New Zealand this summer to learn more English.
 - [2] The person who *inspired me to learn English and go abroad is Ms. Tamiya. She is an English teacher at our school, and she is also *in charge of *ESS. She has taught English here for six years. I remember her words very clearly when she introduced herself. She said, "I like music, cats and visiting other countries. Before I came to this school, I worked as a volunteer in Africa for a few years to protect animals in nature, like elephants. During my stay there, I had to use English to *communicate with others. Then I thought it would be good for young Japanese people to go out of Japan and do some useful things not only for Japan, but also for other countries. I believe English is an important *means to work together *successfully with people around the world. So, I became an English teacher."
 - [3] I was really (2-a) because of her words. I said to myself, "I want to speak English like Ms. Tamiya someday, and also I will study more about other countries." I decided to learn more from Ms. Tamiya, so I became a member of ESS.
 - I studied English very hard, both for English classes and for my club activities. Just before the summer vacation last year, Ms. Tamiya said to the ESS members, "I *entered you in a *debate contest for high school students held in Tokyo in October." When I heard that, I thought I would not be on the team because my English was still (2-b) and there were eight members in our club. Usually debate teams have from two to four people. However, she said all of us would take part in the contest, and we would make two teams. The *theme was "Japan should make English its second *official language." We club members worked together very hard. Through the summer vacation, we collected as much useful information as possible and *organized our *argument.  - [5] Actually, it was very difficult for us to give our opinions in English. Ms. Tamiya was sometimes very *strict. 4 However, in the end, we believed her and continued to practice for the contest. With practice, our *confidence grew. Finally, the day came. We were very (2-c), but when we saw Ms. Tamiya's smile, we were able to *relax. In the contest, we did *as well as possible. And my team won first place!

- [6] After the debate contest, I decided to improve my English skills and have many (2-d) kinds of experiences abroad, just like Ms. Tamiya. So, I took a test to study in New Zealand as an *exchange student and I passed!
- [7] My goal is to study *environmental problems. Actually, I'm very interested in *kiwis. Kiwis are New Zealand birds that don't fly, and now they are an *endangered species. When I go to New Zealand, I'll be able to learn English, but I also want to learn how to 5 kiwis and increase the number of these birds. When I told Ms. Tamiya about my plan, she said it was (2-e).
- [8] I still have two more months to practice English before I leave for New Zealand. My favorite way to practice is talking with Ms. Tamiya and my club members in English. Last year I was afraid of making mistakes in English in front of others, but now I am not afraid any more, because I know we can grow up through making mistakes.
