

2025年度 杉並総合高校における「日本語指導」等の外国人生徒支援について

令和7(2025)年度、本校には在京外国入学生で入学した生徒が計53名が在籍しています。国籍は、ネパール、中国、モンゴル、ベトナム、韓国、台湾、フィリピン(上記は2名以上在籍)など計12か国に渡っています。在京外国人等校で入学した生徒で日本語指導が必要な生徒は、以下の授業や支援を受けることができます。

1) 授業について: *以下の授業はすべて、卒業するために必要な単位として認められます。

*「取り出し授業」とは、HRクラス(40名)ではなく少人数(10名以下)で受ける習熟度別授業です。

1年次生 入学前の「日本語の習得状況テスト」の結果で、「日本語」の勉強が必要と決まった人:

①取り出し授業: 必修科目「現代の国語」(2単位)と「言語文化」(2単位) *国語科以外の取り出しはありません

②学校必修選択科目: 「日本語基礎」(1単位)

第2外国語として、「ハンゲル基礎」・「中国語基礎」の代わりになります。

③「特別の教育課程」(2単位) *日本語の習熟度別授業です。

火曜日と金曜日の7時間目(15:40~16:30)に受けます。

2年次生 1年次に引き続き「日本語」の勉強が必要な人:

①取り出し授業: 学校必修科目「論理国語」(2単位) *国語科以外の取り出しはありません

②学校設定選択科目: 「日本語Ⅰ」(2単位)、「日本語A」(2単位) *「日本語A」は2025年度から新設。

3年次生 2年次に引き続き「日本語」の勉強が必要な人:

①取り出し授業: 学校必修科目「論理国語」(2単位) *国語科以外の取り出しはありません

②学校設定選択科目: 「日本語Ⅱ」(2単位)、「日本語B」(2単位) *「日本語B」は2025年度から新設。

2) 授業以外の支援について:

①中間・期末考査前の勉強会

②「日本語能力試験(JLPT)」の勉強会

③学校生活全般のサポート *火曜日・金曜日の放課後などに実施

④定期考査の問題と解答用紙のルビ振り *国語科の科目は除きます。

⑤1年次必修科目の授業での「入り込み」指導 *一定の条件があります。

⑥面談や電話での通訳の利用

⑦日本語や他言語の多読本貸し出し など

Support for foreign students at Suginami-Sogo High School, 2025

In the 2025 academic year, our school has a total of 53 students enrolled through “Foreign students residing in Tokyo”-based admission. There are a total of 12 nationalities, including Nepal, China, Mongolia, Vietnam, South Korea, Taiwan, Philippines and so on. If you are admitted through “Foreign students residing in Tokyo”-based admission and need language support in school life, you can take the following classes and support opportunities.

1) Classes: *All of the following classes will be accepted as credits required for graduation.

First-year:

For those who need to study Japanese based on the results of the Japanese placement test before entering school:

①"Contemporary Japanese Language" (2 credits) and "Language Culture" (2 credits)

Instead of taking these classes in a HR class of 40 students, you can take them in small groups of less than 10 students. *Note: No small classes for other subjects.

②Compulsory elective subject "Basic Japanese" (1 credit)

It is a substitute for "Basic Korean" and "Basic Chinese", which the students whose mother language is Japanese take as a second language.

③"Special curricula" (2 credits)

You can learn more Japanese on Tuesdays and Fridays, the 7th period, 15:40 -16:30.

Second-year:

For those who need to continue studying Japanese and receiving language support:

①Compulsory subject, "Japanese Language (Logic)" (2 credits)

Instead of taking these classes in a HR class of 40 students, you can take them in small groups of less than 10 students. *Note: No small classes for other subjects.

②Elective Subjects, "Japanese I" (2 credits), "Japanese A" (2 credits)

*"Japanese A" will be newly established from 2025.

Third-year:

For those who need to continue studying Japanese and receiving language support:

①Compulsory subject, "Japanese Language (Logic)" (2 credits)

Instead of taking these classes in a HR class of 40 students, you can take them in small groups of less than 10 students. *Note: No small classes for other subjects.

②Elective subjects, "Japanese II" (2 credits), "Japanese B" (2 credits)

*"Japanese B" will be newly established from 2025.

2) Further Support:

①Examination study support before mid-term and end-term exams

②Study support for “Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT)”

③Additional study support after school on Tuesdays and Fridays

④Hiragana for Kanjis in the answer sheets and exam papers of mid-term and end-term exams

⑤Support from Teaching Assistant during classes of the compulsory subjects for first-year students

*There are certain conditions to get this support.

⑥Use of interpreters over the phone or in interviews with teachers

⑦Books for extensive reading in Japanese and other languages
