Our high school, established in 1981, has a history and tradition spanning over 40 years. To date, over 8,000 students have graduated from our school. The school's mission is to foster students to "acquire solid academic skills in a disciplined school environment and to nurture individuals with broad perspectives for living in an international society." We try to cultivate students who are active in the region, Tokyo, Japan, and the world.

The new uniform introduced in 2020 has an emblazoned logo combining the letters TAGARA and the earth on the jacket, symbolizing Tagara High School's global reach. In addition, the last graduates of the Foreign Culture Course were sent off in 2023, and from the 2024 academic year on, the school has become a general course high school that utilizes characteristics of the Foreign Culture Course in its general curriculum. "From TAGARA to the world! From TAGARA to the future!" As a school that supports the development of students' international awareness and the success of students with roots in various countries and regions, we will promote various initiatives with the aim of nurturing well-rounded people for Tokyo's multicultural society.

Pillars of the School's Educational Activities

Our school focuses on international education and traditional Japanese culture education activities. We provide opportunities for our students to actively use English, such as exchanges with students from international schools and study-abroad students, holding in-school English recitation contests, and participating in national English debate competitions.

In addition, the school's subject "Japanese Tradition and Culture" includes subjects like Tsugaru Shamisen, Japanese drumming, tea ceremonies, shogi, Go, koto music, ceramics, martial arts such as karate and aikido, and animation. In December, we hold a tradition and culture presentation to share what our students have learned.

Local Nature and History

The Hikarigaoka district of Nerima Ward, where our school is located, is rich in greenery. The "Fureai no Michi" that extends from Hikarigaoka Station on the Toei Oedo Line is lined with ginkgo trees that are over 100 years old. The school is located along the tree-lined avenue, past Nerima Aki-no-yo Park, and along Toshimaen Street. The area used to be rich in rice paddies, but it was turned into Narimasu Air Base in 1943, then into Grant Heights, a US military facility after the war, until it was returned to Japan in 1973. The park is a place where visitors can experience the changing nature of the four seasons with its rice paddies and reservoirs that are reminiscent of the olden days.

Community

The school conducts a variety of educational activities with the support of the local community. We value cooperation with the local community, including practical training at kindergartens, supporting after-school programs at elementary schools, volunteer work to clean up parks, and participation in the Hikarigaoka District Festival, Nerima Ward's largest district festival, attended by approximately 10,000 people each year. Additionally, we aim to improve the teaching skills of teachers through mutual class observations with the local junior high school teachers.

8. General Classroom

9. Self-Study Room

Partitioned desks allow students to fully concentrate on their studies in a quiet space/

10. Japanese-style Room

A calm and quiet Japanese-style room used for tea ceremony club activities and traditional Japanese culture classes.

11. Library

The library is always stocked with new books of various genres where you are sure to find at least one book you are interested in!

12. Counseling Room

One school counselor and two youth social workers are available for consultation in a calm and quiet room.

■ Japanese Tradition and Culture

All 3rd year students are divided into 10 courses and receive careful instruction from special instructors. Through the classes, students deepen their understanding of Japanese culture and learn expressions and communication skills. In December, we will hold a presentation to demonstrate and share the results of their studies.



■Class Features

●Proficiency-based classes using ICT

Tagara High School conducts entrance examinations based in Tokyo, with many students from foreign countries attending. Therefore, a variety of languages are spoken and heard in students' daily school life. Students are especially exposed to advanced levels of English, both in class and socially, as there are many native English speakers present. In addition to English, math and science classes are also determined by proficiency levels to offer the most support, even for basic levels. Students engage in inquiry-based learning and presentations using personal computers.



■Special subject: Global Studies course

The three main goals of the program are to “cultivate an attitude of understanding and respect for other cultures as a person living in an international society” and “cultivate the acquisition of knowledge and skills, and the ability to think, judge, and express oneself in order to live independently as a shaper and participant in world peace and a bright future.”



Tokyo Experience

In 2023, we welcomed five international students from Australia. It was a fulfilling experience for the international students, as well as our students as they shared their Japanese school life.

Meikai University Exchange

International students studying at Meikai University were invited to Tagara High School to introduce their home country's culture and recommended sightseeing spots. Our students also learn practical English and the cultures of various countries while preparing for hospitality.

■ **Multicultural Society**

Tagara High School has many students from various countries. This creates a very unique environment for our students where they can experience different cultures and languages from their own that is rare to find in Japanese society. Daily school life gradually globalizes students' values. Students can gain the foundation of international sensitivity that allows them to accept and work with others regardless of their nationality. 

■ Japanese Language Support

For students who entered our school through the entrance exam for foreign residents in Tokyo, we provide Japanese language instruction twice a week after school for one year. Students are taught the Japanese language necessary to understand classes and to obtain the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (N-ken) qualifications, which they can use to advance to higher education or find employment. Students are divided into 5 groups based on J-CAT ability and receive detailed guidance.
