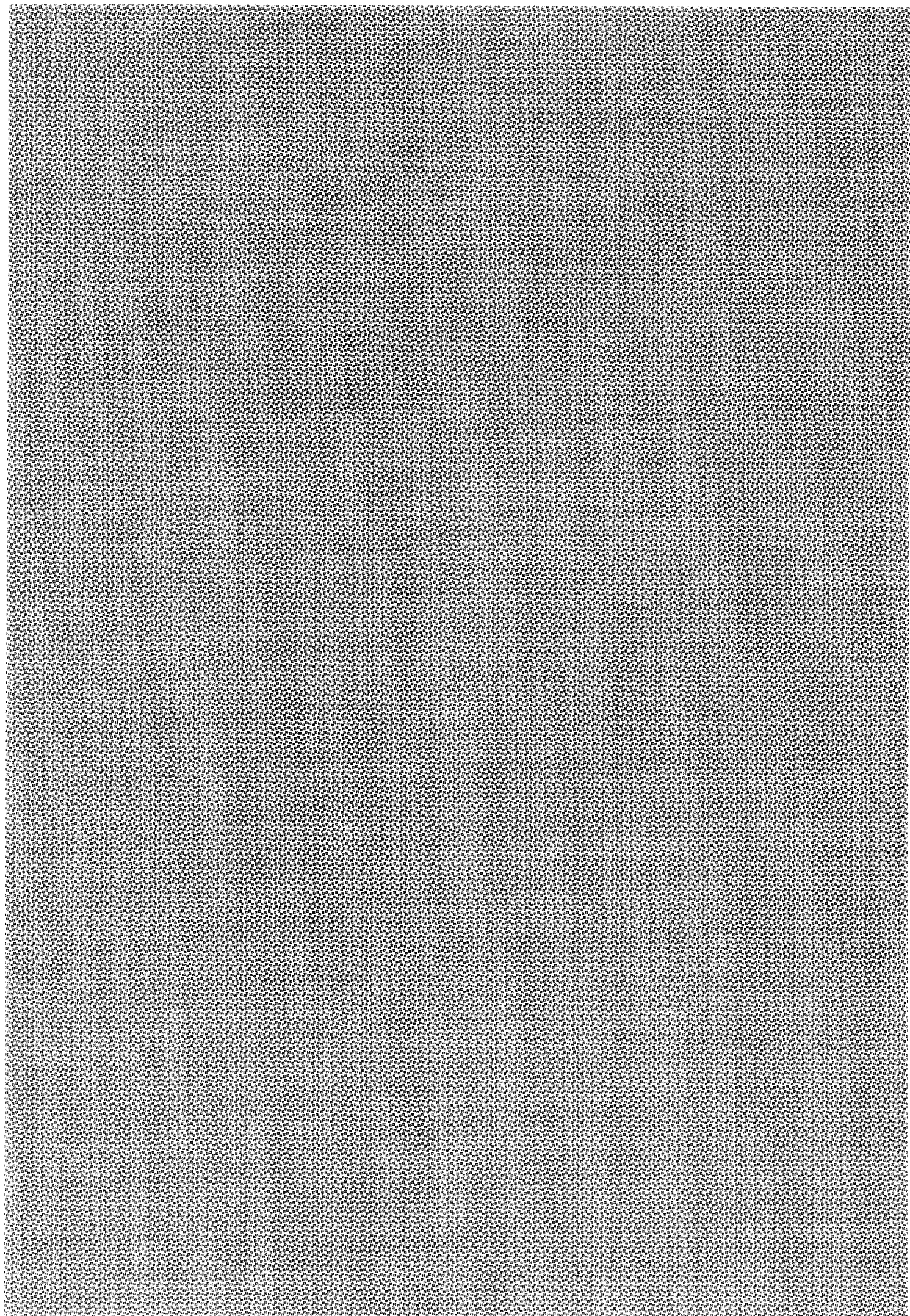

*Dan is an *exchange student from New Zealand and studies at a high school in Tokyo. He sees his friends, Sota and Emi, in the classroom. Sota has a tablet in his hands and is telling something to Emi. Dan walks to them and talks to them.*

Dan: Hi! What are you using the tablet for?

Sota: Hey, Dan. Look at this. Can you guess what it is?

Dan: Um... A railroad map?

Emi: Yes, it is a subway map of Tokyo. You have seen it many times, right?

Dan: Yes, I have. I've been studying in Japan for ten months, and I take the subway to school every day.

Well, (1)

Emi: Sota is trying to tell me how to get to North Station from East Station with the map.

Dan: Oh, why does he have to tell you about that? Taking the subway is so easy for you!

Sota: Of course she knows how to take the subway. I am explaining it in English, and Emi is helping me because she is a very good English speaker. 【ア】

Dan: In English? Why do you have to do that?

Emi: Sota, I guess you should tell Dan the story.

Sota: All right. Yesterday, when I was at East Station, I saw a very tall man carrying a large bag. He was holding a subway map in English. The bag had a *tag that had some information about the man. I read the tag and realized he was from the US.

Dan: ②We often see such situations. Today, many people come to Japan from other countries. OK. What happened after that?

Emi: You decided to talk to the man to help him, right?

Sota: Yes, that's right. I'm not so good at English, but I really wanted to do something to help him. 【イ】

Dan: That's very nice!

Sota: He told me that he wanted to go to North Station. He was trying to find out how to get there, but his smartphone had no battery, so he couldn't use it.

Emi: So, he was trying to use the subway map to find the way.

Sota: Exactly. I talked to the man in English, but he couldn't understand me well. I wanted to tell him how to buy and use the tickets, take the subway, and other things about the subway. I tried to do my best to explain how to use the subway. I thought it was easy. ③But it wasn't.

Dan: Explaining things in a foreign language is very difficult. 【ウ】

Sota: Thank you for saying so, Dan. Well, after talking, he said, "Thank you," and walked to the station office.

The man was asking the staff how to get to North Station. (4) I felt sad.

Emi: Now, you understand why he is trying to explain how to take the subway in English. He is trying very hard to help people in English again.

Dan: I see. I'm glad to hear you are trying to improve your English!

Sota: But I really feel sorry. I talked to the man for more than twenty minutes, but he couldn't understand. I think it was just a waste of time for him.

Dan: Oh, don't say that! I had a similar experience when I came to Japan.

Emi: Really? Can you tell us about that? 【エ】

Dan: Sure. When I arrived in Japan ten months ago, I wasn't able to speak Japanese very well. I had to take a bus to get to my *dormitory, but I didn't know how to get there. I was very nervous and could not talk to a bus driver. Then, a very small girl came to me and said, "What's wrong?" in Japanese.

Sota: What a nice girl! She was so brave!

Dan: She really was! But I couldn't explain my problem well in Japanese, and the girl couldn't speak English. I couldn't understand her words, but she was also using gestures to help me. A few minutes later, she said, "Goodbye," and walked away.

Emi: This really is a similar story!

Dan: (5) I was so moved because 【 ① to / ② somebody / ③ I / ④ didn't know / ⑤ me / ⑥ tried / ⑦ help 】. I was encouraged, and I decided to talk to a bus driver. The driver spoke to me in easy English, and I was able to reach my dormitory.

Emi: You were also brave, Dan!

Sota: I'm really glad to hear that! Now, I feel more encouraged to help other people again! Yesterday, my English was not so good, but next time, I will do better. I want people from other countries to understand me.

Emi: Sota, you are very positive! I think I learned an important thing. Sometimes, the most important thing is not just actually helping someone. Just trying to help somebody is also very important.

Dan: You understand now! Maybe, the man was encouraged to talk to the station staff after talking to you.

Sota: Thank you, I'll do my best!

My name is Misaki. I am now a professional musician. Since I was young, I have loved music and practiced the piano and the guitar. I have also made a lot of songs. Everyone knows that being successful as a musician is very hard. My family and friends often said to me, “It’s very difficult to be a professional musician. You should find another job.” However, the love in my heart for music was really strong. I felt music was the center of my life.

(1) It was not just a hobby to me. Because of the event below, I began to feel this way.

It was a winter day twenty years ago during my high school days. I noticed a poster on an information board at a concert hall. It was about a *handshake event, and the title was “Let’s Meet Julian Summers!” Julian Summers was a famous singer. He spent a lot of time and energy to be a professional singer. Not only his music, but also his way of life, attracted me. Though the poster was about his handshake event, I still could not believe that I was really able to get a handshake from Julian. Then I told my best friend, Aya, about the poster. (2) She already knew about the event. I was surprised that she knew much about it. Julian was really going to give a handshake to his fans for one hour in the concert hall store. The starting time of the event was three o’clock in the afternoon.

On the event day, Aya and I went to the concert hall together. We had our fan letters we wrote to give to Julian. We were thinking about the wonderful moment of meeting him. (3) we got to the concert hall an hour and a half before the starting time, the line was very long and even continued to the *underground. I was a little surprised, but I felt happier to find that many fans were gathering to meet him. We moved to the end of the line and waited.

When the event began, everyone was very excited. But after a while, the line was still not moving. Thirty minutes after the event started, we started to worry. Half of the event was already over, and we were still far from Julian Summers! So, I said to one of the safety staff, “Thirty minutes have already passed. Can we get a handshake from Julian?” He said, (4) “Maybe, I’m not sure.” His words made us more worried.

The ending time of the event came. I almost gave up. I looked at Aya and asked, “Do you think we can meet him?” Aya answered, “I do. We should never give up! Let’s be positive. There’s still a chance.” Then something really amazing happened. There was an announcement, “It is four o’clock. The one hour event time is already over, but from now, Julian is going to give a handshake to each one of you in the line.” We became so happy and were not worried anymore.

Thirty minutes after Julian began giving handshakes to the fans in the line, he finally came in front of us! I was so moved and said to him during the handshake, “I want to be a singer who gives courage to people, just like you.” Julian smiled and said, “If you keep working hard and never give up, your dream will come true.”

His words encouraged me a lot. (5) We waited for a long time and worried a lot. Everything was for that special moment. Our time with Julian was very short. We could not give him the (6) written by us!

But it became a precious memory for us.

Twenty years have passed since the event. I still cannot forget about the wonderful event. I believe that Julian's words at that time gave me valuable directions for my life. His words stayed with me, and they guided me closer to my dream. Since the event day, I have done everything with all my energy to realize my dream.

At first, I started performing on the street or in the cafes. The audience was small, and nothing went well, but I kept trying. (7)

One day, a *producer who watched my music video on the Internet contacted me. He was interested in my music, and offered to make an album of songs together. Finally, my first album came out, and many people listened to it. After that, I have had my concert tours.

On the stage, I am always encouraged by Julian's words. He taught me the importance of having a dream. I really understand that having a dream is the first step to be happy. I also understand that we need to try harder to realize a dream. Thanks to his words, "getting closer to a dream" has become my *motto. I believe that dreams and hard work are the keys to a bright future.
